Double bill performances of 'Raga Abhinaya' (Bharatanatyam) and 'Carnatic Vocal Concert' (South Indian Classical Music) by the wife and husband duo of Eva Isolde Balzer and Manickam Yogeswaran is stated to be as entertaining as it is fulfilling with improvised dancing and singing.

Through yet another exhibition we endeavor to present some of the upcoming artists. *'Upcoming Talents'*, features the work of **Matthew Schofield** and **Geoff Latz**.

'GCF Summer School' is a contemporary performing arts camp conducted by **Geraldine Connor Foundation** which is offered free of cost to youth between 16-25 years and is aimed at developing multiple genres of creative skills of the participants.

Academy

Kala Sangam Academy provides term time weekly classes in dance, music and language of South Asia at our centre and also supports the outreach classes. All the classes are based on graded syllabus, examinations and performances and cater to the need of all ages and abilities. These courses are delivered by highly qualified teachers who are experienced in teaching for various age ranges and abilities.

The learners are also able to achieve Arts Awards and Duke of Edinburgh awards. The senior students are also encouraged in teaching techniques, leadership qualities and offered work experiences. There are also opportunities for further education, research and career development opportunities in south Asian arts for students, artists and teachers

All classes are delivered during the term times and the details are given below :

South Indian (Carnatic) music – The music classes range from vocal, violin, flute, keyboard to veena.

South Indian (Bharatanatyam) dance – the dance classes range from fun classes to the higher levels with the senior learners working towards their debut and graduation.

South Indian language (Tamil) based on accredited syllabus and examinations of the Tamilnadu Virtual University.

Yoga – Ashtanga Yoga classes for adults are delivered by Angela Goodwin a fully qualified Yoga teacher.

The Academy at Bradford is open during term time on Saturdays 9.30am – 2pm.



Cinémathèque Bradford is an initiative by Bill Lawrence and Roy Stafford and part-funded by the Film Hub North in Sheffield, part of the BFI Film Audience Network. Cinémathèque Bradford was set up to maintain the provision of film screenings of specialised films, especially foreign language and smaller independent films in Bradford and to provide film education activities including introductions, notes, discussions and day schools/evening classes for the general public.

The closing night film of the 2014 London Indian Film Festival, Hemalkasa, an inspirational biopic follows the selfless journey of **Dr. Prakash Baba Amte** and his wife **Dr. Mandakini Amte**, a



couple who dedicated their lives for the development of tribal people of Maharashtra, India, in the toughest of conditions with little or no support from the establishment. The project, located at Hemalkasa, eventually led to the formation of a free hospital, a free residential school and an orphanage for injured wild animals. For their pioneering efforts, the Amtes were accorded the prestigious Magsaysay Award for Community Leadership. Nana Patekar and Sonali Kulkarni deliver the performance of their lives in this outstanding example of the best Indian independent cinema. Incredibly moving, the film will leave you with a tear in your eye, a fond smile on your lips and an immediate desire to improve the world that we live in.

Much against the conventions of a traditional south Asian family, this young man seeks to find a higher purpose through his dance form to become the best at what he loves doing most.



Raga Abhinaya Eva Isolde Balzer

Eva Isolde Balzer, an internationally working theatre performer, director and Bharatanatyam dancer trained in Dance Theatre in Chennai and Berlin. Her interests are in the challenges of post-colonial perspectives and her solo 'BalaPina2' created in that context was presented in the finals of Germany's best dance solo and she also collaborates with many such as Johanna Devi Dance Company.

Yoga and Eva will present three different melodic structures (Carnatic ragas) with a focus on their emotive qualities through dance and this will be followed by a story-telling (abhinaya) dance-theatre piece in each raga.

Carnatic Vocal: South Indian Classical Music Concert Manickam Yogeswaran

The origins of South Indian music are traced to prehistoric times and form a favorite subject for many.

Yogeswaran, a singer and multi instrumentalist in this genre of music has appeared in many festivals such as BBC Proms, Womad, Glastonbury, and performed with many renowed orchestras such as the London Philharmonic, BBC Symphony, Bergen National.

He has rendered the ancient *Thirukkural* by poet Thiruvalluvar in 133 ragas and promotes the process of peace and reconciliation in Sri Lanka through his CD and performance titled *Peace For Paradise* and also performs under the banner of *Manickam Yogeswaran and band*.


