Because we want everyone to be able to see performances at Kala Sangam, most shows are **Pay What You Decide**. This means you can book tickets in advance but don't have to pay anything until you have seen a show. There is no set amount, you decide what to pay based on what you can afford and how much you enjoyed the show.
